



## Key Instant Recall Facts Year 4 - Autumn 1

**Focus: Recognise number bonds to 100**

**Aim:** The aim is for children to recall these facts instantly.

<u>Numberbonds to 100</u>	<u>Key Vocabulary</u>
<p>Some examples:</p> $60 + 40 = 100$ $100 - 60 = 40$ $37 + 63 = 100$ $100 - 63 = 37$ $75 + 25 = 100$ $100 - 25 = 75$ $48 + 52 = 100$ $100 - 52 = 48$	<p>What do I <b>add</b> to 65 to make 100? What is 100 <b>take away</b> 6? What is 13 <b>less than</b> 100? <b>How many more</b> than 98 is 100? What is the <b>difference</b> between 89 and 100?</p> <p>This list includes some examples of facts that children should know. They should be able to answer questions including missing number questions, e.g. <math>49 + ? = 100</math> or <math>100 - ? = 72</math></p>

### Top Tips/Activity ideas

**Little and often** is the best way for children to retain these key facts. Practice them whilst on the way to school, during a car journey or at the kitchen table. You don't need to practice them all at once: you could have a fact a day.

Use number bonds to 10 - How many number bonds to 10 help you work out number bonds to 100?

Roll a number - Use 2 dice to create a 2-digit number - which number do you add to this to make 100?
